I design and build the world around us, structures that can include railways, buildings, roads, and bridges. Engineers are often on construction sites checking that the structure is being built properly and I make sure we keep people and nature safe when we're building.

How does what I do make the world a better place?

Civil engineering is all about making the world a better environment to live in. The rail projects I have worked on help to connect people across the country. I have also strengthened a bridge so it did not fall down, and I have done work to prevent towns from being flooded.

What I like about my job

I love that my job helps people and can have a positive effect on the environment. It is very satisfying to see your efforts change the physical world around you and you can see people engaging with and using your work every day.



Challenges I have faced

A lot of girls are not encouraged into construction and technology so sometimes you can be one of a very few women on the job. However, I am seeing the number of women in the industry increasing every year, and I have made some lifelong friends.

If you want to be a senior civil engineer, you need:

- to engage with new technology and adapt to using digital tools so you can use it solve real-life problems
- to want to work with people because we need to work in big teams to build big solutions
- to care for the world around us, because in everything we do we need to make sure it is sustainable
