Guidance for using British Wildlife Dominoes

To prepare the cards:

Print off the images on the following five pages. There are 28 dominoe pieces (6 per A4 page and 4 on the last page) showing 7 different animals that are commonly seen in Britain.

Cut along the black lines so that you have 2 images on each domino piece.

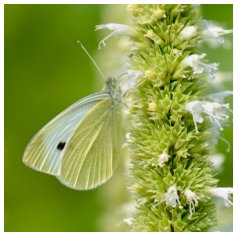
Laminate the cards if you wish.

Using the cards to support learning about British wildlife:

Children match the images of the animals to create lines of dominoes.

Encourage children to look closely at the features of the animals, e.g. the shape of the head, the colour of the eyes, the type of skin, etc.

Ask - How are the animals are similar? How are the animals different?

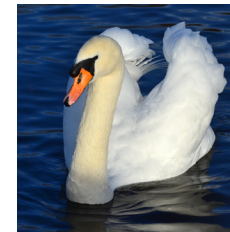
