



## Human Life Cycle Cross-curricular activities

## **English**

Children could interview family members/friends and then write diary entries for different age people. For example, diary of a toddler, diary of a teenager, diary of a mother, diary of a pensioner.

## **Maths**

Data collection: observe people of different ages – where were they seen? What different activities are done by different age groups? How many pushchairs, wheelchairs etc. were seen? What types of clothes /glasses worn?

## History

Children could look at the similarities and differences between people from different historical periods (for example, the Tudors, the Victorians) and compare with the present day: What was the average life-expectancy? How big were families? What did people eat?
